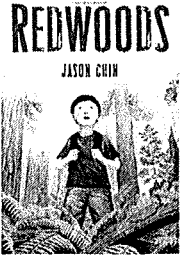

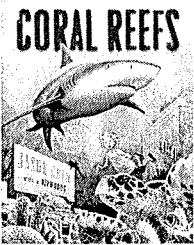

## Pie Is For Sharing

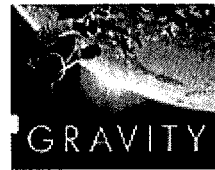

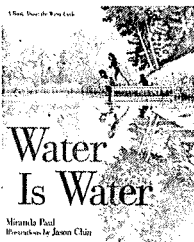

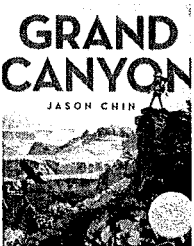
