

JDMS PTG Meeting September 10, 2019 7:00pm at JDMS

Introductions: Jennifer Revercomb called the meeting to order at 7pm in the JDMS Library. Each officer introduced themselves, how long serving on board, and their roles. Jennifer explained the change to only 3 PTG meetings this school year versus the 5 of the past few years. We have today's meeting, January 14, 2020 and May 12, 2020.

Review of June 2019 PTG Events

1. 8th Grade Dance – Alison Kessler chaired this event. Jennifer reported for her, summarized the “Under the Stars” theme and how it was presented in decorations and food, had Bounce House in cafeteria, had Dance Floor outside, food set-up in the hallway that included both hot food and munchies/candies/allergy friendly, etc. The Dance took place on a Friday following the Moving Up Ceremony versus years past it was a weeknight and separate day from Moving Up Ceremony. Think this was well received but may change again this coming year per Mr. Eldridge. He also shared that he learned quickly the speed and reach of Instagram as he took a selfie with a student that night that was posted to Instagram. It got lots of student likes, and now they like his other posts too so he now has followers. He has learned from this that he probably needs to have positive school posts this way.
2. Transportation Breakfast – This also took place in June. Jean reported how each JD school PTG in the district contributes to the event financially, and then we buy all the food and put it all together. We had quite a yummy spread at the Bus Garage, and the strict employees are also invited over. Jean was able to secure the same “bus cookie” girl for each person to have a “take home” bus cookie. The leftover money collected not spent was then used to buy coffee supplies to fuel them the rest of the year and to start up this fall.
3. Review of Final 2018/19 Grant Appropriations - To review, grant money is funds raised by PTG that previously accumulated over the years that from fundraisers that didn't get spent. We have decided to spend this down yearly as it should not continue to sit in our bank account. I have attached the handout Jennifer provided to the meeting attendees, summarizing our grant spending. The biggest purchase was the library furniture just shy of \$6000, then 90 fans for throughout the school just over \$2000. In general, we chose as a Board that one large purchase from grant money should be a capital improvement to the school, while others are enrichment.

Review of 5.21.19 Minutes – Angie Rigdon provided copies at the meeting minutes for those that did not read them on the PTG website. Jean Leiker and Jennifer Revercomb both approved the minutes. Angie announced in terms of correspondence, we received lots of thank you cards for Staff Appreciation week that Karen collected in the office. These were not present to read, but very kind words and thanks.

Budget - Karen Baris – approved by Sheana Martin-Zombek and Jean Leiker

1. Review of Final 2018-19 Budget – Karen Baris reviewed last year's Budget outcomes and it was approved by Kelly Wichmann and Melissa Gorczynski. The 2018-2019 Income and Expense Report is attached to these minutes for details. Big takehomes: Gertrude Hawk made \$1329.66 over-budget! Activity Afternoons also profited more than expected which helped fun some of our sponsored events that went over budget, namely the 7th Grade Musical. We know last year's

numbers were lower, less was collected but costs were the same as years before. Kelly is going to sit and meet with Mr. Bird who took over this play to help him understand the funding, and help with some tracking ideas, etc.

2. Proposed 2019-20 Budget – Karen also provided a handout of the Proposed Budget for this year (also attached) and reviewed that the top section is straight Fundraising. Then the bottom section is the Grants section and other sponsored events. Not much different this year, some amounts slightly changed, and we are sponsoring more for ASP (Stipends) and scholarship students.

PTG Event Calendar, upcoming events

1. This week there will be a packet that includes our calendar of events and Directory instructions and sign-up/order form.
2. 5th Grade Back to School Picnic – Raphael Vaverchak chaired and was in attendance to report. This was her 3rd year. This year the Picnic piggy-backed with Curriculum Night per School scheduling, so we ordered more pizza thinking we would get more bodies but ended up having less people his year. Melissa helped Raphael get volunteers. This is her last year for now (has a 3rd grader so she'll be back in a few years). Rachel Wagner-Gilchrist asked if Andy is keeping the 2 things together moving forward. She got a lot of texts wondering if they should bring their kids for Curriculum Night, confusion over the change since children don't typically attend that. Some parents asked what do we do with the younger siblings when parents go to classrooms. Andy is saying yes we will publicize the full flow of that better next time. Thank you to Raphael!
3. Student Directory – Kelly Wichmann is cochairing with Laura Fisher again. She reviewed how last year's experience move to an online submission for paper and/or electronic version of directory took some tweaking, and how the change affected enrollment in the book. This year she made a very clear 1-2-3 direction page for how to complete the forms. If form doesn't come home with your child, it is also available on PTG website. Directions are the entire first page to be clear. Then we combined the 3 things that need to be returned to PTG into one form as the 2nd page. (3 things being: Directory order, Donation if interested, Sign up to be PTG volunteer) The deadline to return this one page is 9/27/19. Melissa Gorczynski also gave her speech here pleading for volunteers and involvement in order to help all of these events take place. Please sign up!
4. **Gertrude Hawk Fundraiser** -Jean Leiker explained that our fundraising is literally just Gertrude Hawk. A small amount also comes from donations and other things. She co-chairs this with Heather Hendersen. We get 50% of our sales. We kick it off at the end of this month, have a month to sell. A Gertrude Hawk rep comes in during lunchtime to motivate the kids to sell, makes it like a gameshow. Candy usually is delivered before Thanksgiving. Logowear will also be a small profitable fundraiser that is typically done in time for the holidays.
5. **5th-6th Activity Afternoons** – since some 5th grade parents are here, we gave a brief overview of what this is. It is after school on Fridays. The school gets a DJ in the cafeteria, does games in the gym with snacks to buy, then in other rooms they have some other activities (like in the Art Room). \$4 at door, or a canned food drive for \$1 off.
6. **After School Programs (10/7/19 – 11/15/19)** this is not run at all by PTG, 100% run by teachers, Amy Bissetta and Amy Spitzer. They are the chaperones. Forms and details come home from those teachers. We are literally the bank and we supplement them with Stipends for

teachers and for children that need scholarships. All of the sign-up for this is done at school during lunch time so keep your eyes out for this.

7. **Box Tops** Sarah Culligan is doing it one more time but this year Box Tops started a new program where you must download their app and scan your grocery receipts to get Box Top points. This eliminates the cutting, sorting, expiration dates, etc. It is pretty user friendly per Angie who got it on her phone to try out. Not all foods use this scanning yet, some still have the tabs to cut. So this year we will continue the old way and the new way and accumulate in both manners.

Principals Update, Mr. Andy Eldridge – So we are 5 days in!

- There is a lot happening around the building: new windows being installed in the Library, Office area, and in the science rooms due to some leaking. Wiring for our fire alarm system which is tied in to the new PA system which is tied into our new clocks system is all being re-wired. The current system is practically original to the school (52 years old) so this was a large need. The building is also being wired for cameras. We do not have a set timeline for when that will be completed. He is hoping to be active with the Fire system piece at the end of this month.
- We just started today Broadcasting our announcements for the year. They are available on our website if anyone wants to see them – Middle School Daily Announcements. You can see cancellations of sports, etc, anything announced at school so you know before your child comes home.
- We have late buses Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays if they have an appt with their teacher to work on something, or sometimes kids work in the library, etc. A parent requested Andy have a discussion with bus drivers to save some seats at the front of the bus for younger kids on these late buses. He was in agreement
- Eagle Scout project from Sam Smith, its out back. He put in brand new benches, they are stunning, really nice job. He did his own fundraising for it, Jean saw him working on them this summer.
- 3 teachers had babies – have some subs through November for 2 and one is staying out all year. Jeanine Abbott (orchestra), they found someone from NJ to take this place which was short of a miracle due to housing issues. One of our regular staff teachers volunteered their home for this NJ sub to live in while here.
- Enrollment is down a little this year, down to 847 from 915ish. Moved an assistant principal to 5th grade this year to assist with Transition. Karen asked Andy more about decline in #s – apparently this is a known concern of the district, enrollment lowering everywhere.
- 1st day of school we had one bad thing – Director of Transportation was in hospital, and someone had all wrong bus routes and assignments until it was fixed at 3:02...teachers were all outside getting kids on corrected buses.
- The district is transitioning to newer NYS standards, and also is looking at a Capital Project for the next few years (Andy thinks this will be at the Middle School).
- Busy summer of evaluating and planning: looked at State Assessment scores, looked at the demographics of our school, how are we changing what we are doing when we look at these two things. We are going to do more consultant teacher work. We are working to keep kids in their rooms this year and have less pulling-out of classrooms.

- Last year Andy represented CNY as a Principal liaison in Albany. Talked a lot about Best Practice and what people are doing around the state. This year Andy is to be a fellow on a team called the Future Superintendent's Program. 1 fellow will go on weekends (rotates) to Albany through the year to work with principals and look at districts all around to help them evaluate themselves. Demographic analysis – no one there knows JD but he gets great comments: pretty amazing you have a decent size school, you get so much support from your PTG and BLT. You are primed to do this "Schools to Watch" with what you have b/c not all schools have what we have demographically.
- Andy announced there will be 4 Key frames of focus this year: 1. The political structure as a building, how do we build coalitions, community relationships, 2. Structurally how are we setting up our building to do these things. 3. Human Resources, are we supporting our people to grow, 4. How are we celebrating, how are we being Symbolic of our school. These are the 4 frames we are working on, which takes us to...
- This year we are completing 2 questionnaires a week to be a School to Watch. We are shining a mirror on ourselves to evaluate what we are doing – you will see surveys coming home, we need your input. We would like to get 40% at least return on feedback through these surveys. We have terrific staff.
- Tomorrow night is Curriculum Night for 6th, 7th, 8th. Logistically will be difficult moving people around due to everything being worked on in the building but they worked hard on the rotating schedule and hope it works well.. Each teacher group will present.
- Friday will be our first Safety Drill, will be a Lock Down. Dewitt Fire and Police will assist. We've done a Fire Drill everyday that we've been back. 2 questions on Fire Alarms, will it be voice activated? Andy asking for both, bell and voice and visual. 2nd question is the sound an issue, was it too loud? Parent of a 5th grader with autism said more warning the alarm was coming would've been beneficial.
- Parent asked with only 3 mtgs, how can we give feedback on these 4 frames (which we are all so happy are all taking focus). Answers the surveys that come out. Andy accepts emails, and we can still communicate through the officers as well.
