- Gather more comprehensive and valid data on school conditions
- Focus attention on quality of teacher-student relationships as well as peer relationships
- Identify strengths as well as areas that need improvement
- Measure progress toward our strategic goals

Timeline

- 2018- NYSED increased their focus on School Climate based on NY's Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) plan- One area of focus was implementation of a School Climate Survey
- 2020- JDCSD reviewed products to pilot
 - Comprehensive School Climate Inventory (CSCI)
 - Pride Learning Environment Survey
 - School Climate Survey
- 2021- JDCSD piloted the Panorama Survey
- 2022- JDCSD first formal administration of the Panorama SCS
- 2023- JDCSD contracted with Panorama for full SCS and data analysis






Successes



MDES- Moses DeWitt Elementary School performed consistent with the national average for grade 3 & 4 in the student survey. Additionally, MDES scored 63% favorable responses in Engagement. (80th%)




Success by Building

JDHS- The Jamesville DeWitt High School performed consistent with the national average on all 6-12 measures in the student survey

JES- Jamesville Elementary School performed consistent with the national average for grade 3 & 4 in the student survey

TES- Tecumseh Elementary School performed consistent with the national average for grades 3 & 4 in five of the seven categories in the student survey.

JDMS- The Jamesville DeWitt Middle School performed consistent with the national average on all 5-8 measures in the student survey. Additionally, the middle school scored 79% favorable responses for Teacher-Student Relationships (90th %)







School Action



JDHS

• Through a BLT subcommittee we are reviewing data and identifying action points.



 An area of focus will increasing participation in both the staff and family surveys.







JDMS

- The middle school has taken corrective action regarding communication gaps.
- Organized weekly meetings with all students (one day a week via homeroom) and faculty (daytime meetings) with administration.



• Formation of professional learning committees to increase shared decision making.





JES

- Slides were reviewed at the "Back to School" faculty meeting.
- Highlights surrounded parent participation, student feelings of belonging, staff/teacher feedback and staff climate/culture with political views.
- The K-8 Social Studies Framework was shared with the staff for review. The NYS inquiries will be a focus this year in the hopes of framing social studies curriculum to be standard driven.



• The JES BLT is continuing its work with belonging, focusing on assemblies and the buddy groups.



• More admin visitations are happening and the TOSA/Admin shared visits will help with giving feedback and evaluating performance.







MDES

- During our back to school staff meeting, a general overview of the data was presented to all staff members with a focus on student belonging, family engagement and the desire staff expressed for additional feedback.
- Our BLT dove into the data during our first meeting of the year and is currently narrowing specific goals and action steps related to student belonging and family engagement.
- Admin classroom visits are more frequent and the TOSA/Admin shared visits will provide additional support and feedback.







TES

- Presented to entire staff at welcome back to launch school year off; used protocols for staff to engage in reflection on information and admin modeled same reflection & takeaways from staff & teacher feedback
- Created building goal at BLT as response to student feedback in order to improve student experience at recess & lunch (students can now sit with any peer in their grade level at lunch Grades 2-4; working on coordinating quarterly alternate activities at recess time, created committee for wellness day)
- TOSA/Admin shared visits to get into classrooms more frequently







PPS

• The district is providing 1.5 days of PD for all special education teachers and their partner general education teachers around consultant teaching. This training will include teaching assistants.
